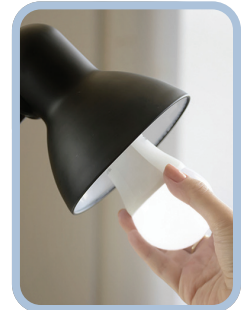

The **Comfort Partners Program** is available to any New Jersey household having an income at or below 250% of the federal poverty guidelines.

2026 Income Guidelines

(250% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines)

Size of Family	Weekly Income	Monthly Income	Yearly Income
1	\$767	\$3,325	\$39,900
2	\$1,040	\$4,508	\$54,100
3	\$1,313	\$5,692	\$68,300
4	\$1,587	\$6,875	\$82,500
5	\$1,860	\$8,058	\$96,700
6	\$2,133	\$9,242	\$110,900
7	\$2,406	\$10,425	\$125,100
8	\$2,679	\$11,608	\$139,300

For family units with more than 8 family members:
Add \$273 to the weekly income, \$1,183 to the monthly income,
or \$14,200 to the yearly income for each additional member.

- Households that receive Section 8 Housing, SSI, TANF, SNAP, or GA may still be eligible for the Comfort Partners program. (Income verification may be required.)
- The customer must also use the home as a primary residence and be the ratepayer of record with the electric or gas utility.
